



Q3 What is your age?



Q4 How long have you lived in Boone County?



Q5 If you live in Boone County, what best describes you? [choose one]







It is clear from our city and others around the country that these expensive attempts often fail, and those issues will eventually spill into unincorporated areas and become a major County problem as well. While the compassionate efforts will continue, I hope our county can figure out a way to obtain a county level court system to enforce basic ordinances (Loitering / Panhandling / Littering / Peace Disturbance) that will keep those who wish to come here with the expectation that there are some simple expectations that must be followed. This will also keep low level violations out of state level circuit court and provide some relief to the criminal court system. This will also give relief to law-abiding and tax-paying citizens in our County that they will have some structure and expectations about the quality of life. I believe having compassion with this growing population has to walk hand in hand with an enforcement mindset. This leads me to my third problem, which is we need to start tracking and analyzing how our homeless population arrives here. Rather, I believe growth should be adequately managed and monitored very closely so that quality of life for existing residents isn't impacted. For example, water infrastructure is a concern of mine for my Boone County neighborhood. In particular, water pressure and water quality (PWSD #4 water district) is borderline unacceptable for being so close to Columbia (which has much better water in my opinion), and close to Columbia's north water tower. More affordable homes like mine continue to be built in my neighborhood which is great, but with each new home added to the water supply, the already sub-par water pressure will worsen, and risk for contamination and poor initial treatment grows. If this is closely monitored and fixed as necessary, resident frustration and a potential impact to home values in areas potentially underserved by infrastructure, can be minimized. This instance can be applied to many other things like roads, electric service, crime, etc. Major negative impacts can be avoided for current residents if the county takes a more proactive approach to everything, instead of reactive. 




Q20 Do you agree or disagree with the statement, "The loss of prime farmland is a concern in Boone County"?







Q4 How long have you lived in Boone County?



Q5 If you live in Boone County, what best describes you? [choose one]







Q8 What are the top three strengths of living in Boone County? [choose up to three]










Q19 Do you agree or disagree with the statement, "Farming and family farms are important to the economy of Boone County"?


Q20 Do you agree or disagree with the statement, "The loss of prime farmland is a concern in Boone County"?



Q21 How would you rate the following for natural areas, parks, open space, and recreation facilities in Boone County?











Q4 How long have you lived in Boone County?

Q5 If you live in Boone County, what best describes you? [choose one]







Q19 Do you agree or disagree with the statement, "Farming and family farms are important to the economy of Boone County"?






Q20 Do you agree or disagree with the statement, "The loss of prime farmland is a concern in Boone County"?




Q4 How long have you lived in Boone County?

Q5 If you live in Boone County, what best describes you? [choose one]





Q8 What are the top three strengths of living in Boone County? [choose up to three]







Q17 What are the key reasons for locating a business in Boone County? [Choose all that apply]









Q19 Do you agree or disagree with the statement, "Farming and family farms are important to the economy of Boone County"?






Q20 Do you agree or disagree with the statement, "The loss of prime farmland is a concern in Boone County"?

Q21 How would you rate the following for natural areas, parks, open space, and recreation facilities in Boone County?






